Probable Loss of an Emigrant Ship—Forty Dead Bodies washed ashore.

April 19.—A despatch just received from Absecon says that up to last night about forty dead bodies—men, women and children, had been washed ashore on that beach and Brigantine beach, about a quarter of a mile across the channel.

These seen by our informant appear to be German—they are all much disfigured, however.

Bodies were washed ashore all the time at Absecon.

A bed was also found further up the beach, but nothing has yet been discovered to indicate the name of the lost vessel.

On Monday last the storm here was most furious, unroofing houses, barns, &c.

Seven vessels were blown ashore,—one a hermaphrodite brig (name unknown) from Norfolk to Boston, with crew,—the crew were in the rigging, except one who swam ashore.

The schooner F. B. Alston, from New York, with a cargo of lumber, took fire and was consumed; with the exception of her sails and rigging. The schooners Bailey and Minerva were also ashore, and the latter had but recently been got off at an expense of \$2,300.

The sea was so heavy that no boat could live in it. Seventy sail remained in the Breakwater.

The bodies of two women, one man and a boy, were washed ashore, at Absecon Beach on Monday—they appeared to have been emigrants.

It was reported yesterday, that three more bodies had been found. The Wrecks at Barnegat—Latest from the Underwriter.

The ship's surgeon came up to the city this morning by way of Keyport; he reports the ship as lying head off shore, on the outer bar, with 18 feet of water under her bow, and 14 feet aft.

About 50 tons of cargo had been thrown overboard, and all hands were still engaged in throwing over boxes of tin, &c., to lighten her.

Sail has been kept on her, and with the assistance of a steam tug, it was expected she would be got off at high tide, which would be at 11 A. M. The ship does not leak of any consequence.

The steamer Delaware, hence for Philadelphia, which had been lying at anchor inside the hook from Saturday until Tuesday morning, in endeavoring to render assistance, lost her yawl, and two of her men are drowned.

Russel Sturges' steam tug Tiana and Achilles, with schooners in tow, have been sent down to her. The tug Huntress has gone down for her passengers. There is also a Philadelphia boat there, (probably the Delaware.)

The Titan will afterwards proceed down the beach to the assistance of the ship or passengers at Long Beach, 8 miles below Barnegat, which went ashore on Saturday night.

The ship seen by the steamship Roanoke, on Tuesday morning, standing in the beach; was no doubt the packet ship Manhattan, from Liverpool for New York (since arrived), and it is supposed saw the position of the U. in time to haul her off; they had been in company previously.

Packet ship Manhattan, Peabody, from Liverpool, March 21st, came into port this morning with 750 passengers. She has had five deaths among the passengers: 6th inst., when in lat. 40 34, lon. 43 06 fell in with large quantities of ice, and sank it for 60 hours, with an easterly wind at the time. Was off Sandy Hook Sunday last, and was obliged to haul off shore in consequence of the gale, and was blown to the southward 80 miles.—N. Y. Ex.
