

Peril of St. Louis.

St. Louis, August 8.—A dreadful riot occurred in this city this evening.

The mob destroyed a large number of drinking houses, and broke the furniture to atoms.

The crowd supplied themselves with axes and smashed everything that would yield to blows.

It is rumored that five persons have been killed, and a large number wounded.

The mob threatened to attack the College.

The office of "The Anzeiger" has been attacked, and is now threatened again.

Two arrests have been made.

About sixty houses, mostly Irish groceries of the lowest order, have been destroyed.

On Morgan street there is not an Irish grocery left.

New York, August 11.—The steamship Empire City, from Aspinwall, with California dates to the 15th ult., (the same as brought by the Star of the West at N. Y., on Monday,) arrived here this morning.
