MEMBERS AND REGULATIONS.

The Fair ground of the most beautiful located in the town and of convenient access to visitors...

Members and diplomas will be paid on and after the first Wednesday of November and until the 1st day of January, 1861.

Every person wishing to be enrolled as a member of this Society must apply on or before the first day of the fair...

Exhibition of Ladies and gentlemen's horsemanship will take place on Tuesday and Wednesday evening at 3 o'clock.

Exhibitors must become members of the Society and have their animals and articles entered on the Secretary's books on or before the 15th day of October.

No horse shall be entered or allowed a premium unless he is free from disease.

Judges are expressly required not to award premiums to over-fat animals.

When there is but one exhibitor, although he may show several animals in one class...

Discretionary Premiums.—No viewing committee shall award any discretionary premiums.

Rules of Showing.—The name of the plowman must be given as well as the kind of plow to be used at the time of entry.

The time allowed to do the work will be two hours. The width of furrow to be ten inches or over and the depth not less than six inches.

The premiums offered by the Society will be awarded to the individuals, who in the judgment of the committee, shall do their work in the best manner...

Each plowman to strike his own land, and plow entirely independent of the adjoining land.
