All breeds come together in this class and compete with each other. To be judged, 1st, by their good points and symmetry of frame, 2d, by the ability to fatten, (is the animal a good hand), 3d, milking qualities, 4th, Size, 5th, give no premium to any animal until they are satisfied it will produce good stock. To this end the Judges shall satisfy themselves in regard to the stock of aged bulls and cows. The animal that possesses these qualities in the greatest perfection should draw the Sweatpates, whether it be Durham, Ayreshire, Hereford, Devon, Grade or Native.
