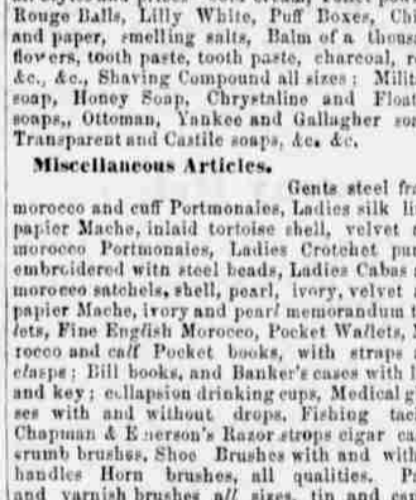

PROCLAMATION OF THE ELECTORS OF ELECTORS OF A PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT OF THE U. S.

Whereas, by an act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and the several supplements thereto, it is provided, that the electors of the several counties of the Commonwealth, qualified to vote for members of the General Assembly, shall hold an election at the same places at which the same members shall have been voted for at the preceding election...

Now, therefore, I, FREDERICK G. MILLER, high sheriff of Clearfield county in pursuance of the duty enjoined on me by the Act above referred to, and the said supplements thereto, do issue this, my Proclamation, giving notice to the free-men of said county qualified to vote for members of the General Assembly, to meet for their several election districts on TUESDAY the 6TH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, then and there, between the hours of EIGHT o'clock in the morning, and SEVEN o'clock in the evening of said day, to vote for TWENTY-SEVEN ELECTORS of a President and Vice President of the United States.

The Electors of the County of Clearfield will take notice that the said Election for Electors of a President and Vice President of the United States will be held at the following places: At the house of Samuel M. Smith for the township of Becaria. At the house of Aeph Ellis, for the township of Bell.

At the house of James Bloom, Sr, for the township of Bloom. At the house of Edward Albert for the township of Boggs. At the house of William Hoover for the township of Bradford.

At the public house of R. W. Moore, for Brady township. At the house of John Young for the township of Burnside. At the school house near Simon Borahugh's, for the township of Chest.

At the Court House for the Borough of Clearfield. At the house of Jacob Maurer for the township of Corvinton. At the house of Isaac Bloom Jr, for the Borough of Curwensville.

NOTICE IS FURTHER HEREBY GIVEN, That all persons, except Justices of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of trust, under the government of the United States or of this State, or of any incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise, a subordinate officer or agent, who is or shall be employed under the Legislative, Executive or Judicial Departments of this State or of the United States, or any city, or incorporated district, and also that every member of the general and of the State Legislature, or of the common or select council of any city, or commissioned or incorporated district, are by law incapable of holding or exercising, at the same time, the office or appointment of Judge, Inspector, or clerk of any election of this Commonwealth; and that no inspector, judge, or other officer of any such election, shall be eligible to any office voted for.

And the Return Judges of the respective districts aforesaid are requested to meet at the Court House, in the Borough of Clearfield, on the First Friday next after the said First Monday of November then and there to do those things required of them by law.
