EXTRAORDINARY PHENOMENA IN BORING FOR OIL IN CANADA. - A number of residents of Michigan went ever to Sombra, C. W. some time since, and commenced boring some fifteen or twenty feet from a creek, under the belief that oil would be found. When they had gone down about fifty goven feet they struck a vein of gas. On removing their augur the gas rushed forth with great force from the aperture, and continued to throw up dry sand for an hour. 
