The Stay Law. HARRISBURG, May 19.—The following is a true copy of the bill offered by Mr. Duffell, and which has passed both branches of the Legislature, relative to judgments and executions:

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That upon all judgments now remaining unsatisfied, or which may be obtained within six months from the passage of this act, there shall be a stay of execution for one year from the passage hereof...
