

fresh lime in its place, and whitewash the beams and boards, and the fleas will soon vanish.

Take up all the carpets, beat them thoroughly with a slender rod, and scatter a little black pepper around the sides of the room where the edges of the carpet are to be laid. Then, once every fortnight, whip the outside breadths upon the floor with a Treasurer. light switch, and the remaining moths will be beaten out.

The chinch or bed bug can be routed, by the first washing all the parts of the bedstead with cold water, and then, with a brush, applying corro-tive sublimate desolved in spirits, or an amalgam of lard and quicksilver rubbed together.
