More Troops Called Out—Proclamation of Governor Curtin.

HARRISBURG, July 4.

The following Proclamation was issued by the Governor to-day:

In the name and by the authority of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Andrew G. Curtin, Governor of the said Commonwealth,

A PROCLAMATION:

More men are required for the suppression of the rebellion. Our regiments in the field are to be recruited to their original strength, and in addition new regiments are to be formed.

Pennsylvania has hitherto done her duty to the country. Her treemen are again called upon to volunteer in her defense, that the blood of her sons who have already fallen may not have been shed in vain and that we may hand down to our posterity the blessings of union and civil and political liberty, which we derived from our fathers.

The number of men now required and the regulations for enlistments, will be made known forthwith in General Orders.

WHEN THE MEN OF PENNSYLVANIA WILL HOLD THEMSELVES IN READINESS FOR PROMISES WITH THE NECESSARY DEMAND UPON THEIR GALLANT AND PATRIOTIC SPIRIT.

Our noble Commonwealth has never yet faltered, and must stand firm now when her honor and every thing that is dear to her are at stake.

Given under my hand and the great seal of the State, at Harrisburg, this fourth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and of the Commonwealth the eighty-second.
