The Teachers of Clearfield county are respectfully requested to meet at the Town Hall in Clearfield, on Monday the 28th day of September next, at 10 o’clock A.M., for the purpose of organizing a TEACHERS’ INSTITUTE, to continue in session one week. The object of this meeting is, for the attainment of greater proficiency in the different branches of study in the art of teaching, and for the discussion of such topics as relate to the advancement and interest of the common schools. Teachers are requested to prepare essays, or short addresses on practical subjects connected with the theory and art of teaching, so that the exercises may be as interesting and attractive as possible.
