THE GOSPEL NOT PREACHED TO THE Masses .- Doubtless churches will increase according to the demand for them, and the statistics of our cities indicate that at the present time the large majority do not care to hear the gospel. How to reach the non-wor-shiping masses is the great practical question of the day. The statisstantially correct: The population of Boston is 192,000. There are one hundred places of worship, allowing six hundred seats for each church, and 60,000 only get into the churches, leaving 132,000 out of church on Sunday. There are 250 chapels and churches in New York city, many of them very small; allowing that there are sittings for 700 person in each upon an average, the churches will accommodate 250,000 people There are, probably, including strangers in transition, 950,000 people in New York every Sunday, leaving 700,000 that could not get seats in church. Allowing 200,000 for those physically incapacitated from attending service, and 500,000 remaining habitually absent from church. The churhes in the United States number bout 70,000.
