Sunday Schools. THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE ASSOCIA-TION -The cause of Sabbath-school instruction is growing in this State. Among the latest evidences of it is the recent formation of a State Association. The conviction has been growing for several years in the minds of Sabbath-school workers, that such an organization was needed. It was believed that organization would prodoce greater vigor and thoroughness, and especially that it would lead to a more thorough supply of the waste places. The successful example of other States, both east and west, strengthened this convictio , and led to the holding of several important conventions, and finally to a matured organization. The first State Convention was held in Philadelphia, in May, 1862. The second was held at Pittsburg in May, 1863, and adjourned to THOS. J. The new Association numbers in its Board of Managers some of the best known and most active Sabbath school men in the State. Its President, Matthew Newkirk, Esq., is a veteran in the cause. Hon. James Pollock, Chairman of the Business Committee, is too well known to need introduction to any Pennsylvania renders. Rev. Alfred Taylor, State Secretary, is a live man, and thoroughly acquainted with the Sabbath-school The board has appointed its committees, and is already in working

The work to be done by such an organization is large and various, and practically without limit. It will be finished only when every child in the State is in the Subbathschool, and every child in the Sabbathschool is converted and brought into the church. There are, however, two points of immediate practical importance to which the Maungers should give attention. One is the formation of county associations; the other is the holding of Normal Institutes.

A Solite society is to accomplish its work mainly by awakening and or-ganizing the efficiency of others. It does not expect to form schools, or to do the work of teaching. Its aim as a central organization, is to put itself into kindly contact and sympathy with local influences all over the State. There is no county in the State in which there are not to be found warm-hearted, earnest Christians, men and women, ready to cooperate actively and wisely. first business of the State Association is to find out these carnest workers. If half a dozen men of the right stamp can be got together in any county, they can easily devise measures for the perfecting a county organization, and can secure some one competent and willing to undertake the duties of county secretary. These county or MEN AND BOYS' CLOTHING, ganizations are the very life of the system, coming directly into contact aug!'67! PHILADELPHIA, Pa. with the schools and actual work The measure of the success achieved by the State Association will be the number and character of the county associations it can call into existence. These county associations ought to have much of a missionary character and spirit. They ought to aim, in the first place, to make a complete Sabbath-school census, finding out exactly how many children are in the Sabbath school and how many are out DRUGS AND MEDICINES, of it. In the second place, they ought to aim to bring every neglected child under the influence of religious instruction, and to see that a school is established wherever there is a population sufficient to sustain one.

We have spoken of Normal Institutes. The State Association has a great and immediate work to do in regard to them. These Institutes do not train teachers. It is a grave mistake to hope for any such result from them. But they are of the utmost importance in diffusing right ideas among teachers. There are great truths in teaching, which are never rightly apprehended until we see them practically illustrated. From a good Model Lesson, a live teacher. will gather ideas that come to him in no other way. And then what noble thoughts are brought out by some of the lecturers on these occasions, and House and Sign Painter and Paper how many practical blots are elicited in the free and fraternal interchange of views that takes place! These spe cial Institutes in large and influential centres are most important means of perfecting our educational machinery The State Association should aim to hold at least fifteen or twenty such during the current year.-Sunday-School Times,
