"There are three designated places where that business is carried on extensively: One place known as Bennett's Pier, ten miles from Milford; another known as Big Stone, nine miles from Milford; and the others known as Cedar and Slaughter Beach, about seven miles from this place. Bennett's Pier this year seems to be more frequented than the other two. eight large seines, measuring from 150 to 250 yards long, and from 12 to 15 0 mee deep, and each end of the seine has! about 500 yards of rope attached to it. The seine and rope are put into a large boat. Some three or four men enter it, leaving a sufficient number of men on shore to manage one end of the rope The rope is let out from the boat as she leaves the shore, to the length of same 400 or 500 yards. The seine is then let out in a kind of half-moon shape. The rope at the other end is put out as the boat returns to shore. Then four men at the end of the rope hand the seine in as fast as possible. They walk along the beach as the seine drops along with the tide, so as to keep square with it. It generally takes from two to five ORVIS & ALEXANDER, hours to make a haul, owing to the large quantity of fish landed. times it takes longer to clear the seine of fish than it does to make the haul. The hands average from 5 to 500 bushels. Some years ago we saw a seine landed that was supposed by all to have had 1,000 bushels in it. The fish range from 10 to 30 cents per bushel on the beach, and we have been informed that they have sold for three cents per bushel. These fish are generally more abundant in the months of April May and June, and about the last of October they disappear. The fishermen are a hard working set of men. It is often the case that they fish all day in their wet clothes, and scarcely stop to eat, when buyers are plenty. Each one strives to out do the other, both in hauling and selling after they land the fish. Sometimes the competition is so great that the fish are sold for a mere song. Persons come from a distance of 25 or 30 miles to buy fish on these shores, and some carry away from 10 to 40 bushels. We have seen on the beach at one time at least 100 wagons waiting for the fish to be landed, and when the seines land they flock around them, fearful lest they should not get their supply. They are carried home, and the most of them salted down for winter use. Fresh trout are now selling in our market at fifty cents per bushel."
