Stereotyped Lines.

Every month—and we have said this same thing monthly ever since Grant came into office—the official publications of the Treasury Department have pretended to show a reduction of the great national debt; but it is a mere pretence, for the debt has not been reduced; the figures in the statements are frauds; the Washington head of the Financial Bureau is a knave and a scoundrel to those hood-winked and cheat the poor duped taxpayers and wealth-producers. The public debt, May 7, 1870, was \$2,420,534,334. The public debt of April 2, 1865, was \$2,366,053,077, showing an increase in the five years of \$54,490,257! But this is not all the increase. When a debt, which calls for a paper dollar, is changed in its character, and made to call for a gold dollar, it is as much increased, *de facto*, as the difference in value between the paper and the gold. From May 1, 1865, to May 1, 1870, there were no less than \$1,000,000,000 of the paper dollar debt transformed in to the gold dollar debt, which increased the national obligation, the tax upon the sweat and toil of the white man, thirties cents on every dollar. And how much, oh! mathematical taxpayer, did the weight upon your backs increase? How much was the increase of the public debt by this change? No less than \$130,000,000— one hundred and thirty millions of dollars—was virtually added to the footings of the public debt by making \$2,107,943,200 of the debt bear interest in 1870, against \$1,902,861,212, which bore interest in coin in 1865. There were, therefore, \$120,000,000 actually added to the public debt in 1870, beside the addition of \$54,490,257 in its growth from other causes, making in all, an increase in the public debt in the past five years of \$184,490,000! And yet the lying rascals who hold official place and power, and their venal and shameless echoes, are periodically declaring “the debt is being reduced monthly.” People of the United States are you never to protest against a condition of things at the seat of government which embarrasses you, shackles you, impoverishes you, to a greater and greater degree yearly? Are you satisfied to be taxed to the extent of \$350,000,000 per year, and get such fruits, socially, politically and commercially as you now do? Will you allow yourselves to be thus depredated, deceived, and truly spitted upon year after year by your corrupt rulers, and then continue to vote them into office again, as you have done? Look, people of the United States, at the treatment you have received by the present Congress, touching taxation. Your appeals for relief have been trampled upon; your prayers snared at; your supplications made merry over by the heartless gang of incapables, calling themselves Senators and Representatives, disgracing not only the Council Chambers of the nation, but deeply disgracing the people who sent them there. For ten long, weary years, commercial progress, the advance in national wealth and refinement, the growth even of the common intelligence of this once great and progressive republic—all have been impeded, shackled, clogged, by ignorance, corruption, and political vandalism in high places. The party in power is composed of the weakest intellects in the whole body politic. Narrow-minded, sordid, one-sided, and basely wicked, under its rule the nation is being utterly ruined. Will the people awake, and put on their strength, ere it is too late? The present government and administration is a daily living lie. From its beginning it has been one huge monstrous falsehood. Greenbacks Doomed--National Bank Power Supreme.

It is clear now, from the voting in the House of Representatives on the national currency question, that the majority of the members are in favor of increasing the national bank circulation, and of pushing the legal tender out of existence. This was seen when Mr. Garfield's substitute for the Senate Currency bill was before the House recently when it was passed by a vote of 98 to 1, in 115 days. This bill as it now stands authorizes an additional issue of ninety-five millions of national bank notes, and requires the cancellation of forty-five millions of three per cent certificates. Several amendments were proposed to Mr. Garfield's bill, to issue more legal tenders and to make the entire circulation of the country a legal tender or greenback one, and to withdraw the national bank currency. These were voted against by a large majority, which shows that the national bank influence is supreme in the House of Representatives. It is the same, no doubt, in the Senate. The next moment will be to withdraw altogether the legal tenders, and to give the whole circulation of the country to the banking associations. One of the most significant votes was that on the proposition of Mr. Bushard, requiring national banks to retain and keep in coin or Treasury coin certificates, as part of their reserve, the interest falling due upon the bonds deposited as security for circulation until the reserve required to be kept shall consist wholly of coin and coin certificates.
