back in her career and Prussia pushed on with accelerated speed. But we repeat, the Republicans of Europe and this country will not look at the question in this light. They will watch carefully the course of events, as they point towards freedom or despotism. If Prussia is willing that France shall select her own form of government, the laws to govern her people, the mea to execute them, there will be something for the masses to approve. But if the Bourbons are forced upon an unwilling country, if France and Frenchmen are carsed again by a restoration of this family to power, then the victory at Sedan will certainly bring no joy to the hearts of freemen, no matter where located. Already the despotic organs of Europe are declaring that Promis, Russia and England are considering a treaty of peace. It rests upon the restoration of the Orleanists to the throne of France, the establishment of a German Empire under King William, and the abrogation of all pledges made by Napoleon to the Kings of Austria and Italy. Austria is to be turned into a mere province of Prussia, and Italy treated as circumstances may demand. If Prussia demands French territory as a compensation for the expenses of the war, ancient Lorraine and Alsace are to be turned over to William -These are the provinces most suited for her purpose. United with Baden, they would form a convenient government for the Grand Duke of Baden, who is the son in law of the King of Prussia. Lorraine is now represented in France by the following Departments: Meuse, Moselle, Vosges and Mearthe. The first contains a popu lation of 305,540; the second, 446,457; the third, 415,485, and the fourth, 428,643 -a total of 1.596,125. In Alsace there are two Departments-Haut-Rhin and Bas Rhin. In Haut-Rhin there are 515,802 inhabitants, in Bas-Rhin, 573,574 people-total, 1,008,376, or a grand total in all the departments of 2,660,501. Baden has 1,369,291, which united with that of THE BEREIN BROTHERS, Lorraine and Alsave, would give the Resers. BALOIT, BUCKLEY, BREEZE, BICHARS-Duke of Baden 4,058,702 subjects, all of whom would be vassals of the Emperor of Germany. If that general arrangement is carried out Europe will be bound hand and foot and torned over to unrelieved despotism. There will not be a hope left for Republicanism in Europe The wheels of progress in that direction will be reversed, and men lose what rights they have rather than acquire others. For some years the leading governments of Europe have been bending in the direction of liberalism. Russia, Italy, France and Austrian have made con cessions to the people. They have aided the masses in getting nearer to the fountain of power. They have lightened the chains by which men are bound to the thrones of power -But the indicated current of events flows now in an opposite direction -Centralization is the leading ides. 
