The Social Spirit of San Francisco.

Fine Dressing in Church.
Religion is growing costly and burdensome to the poor in the way of fine clothes. We reproduce from the Watchman and Reflector, the following thoughts on this subject:
—It is of any use to protest against the prevailing custom of making our churches on Sunday exhibition rooms of the latest fashions in wearing apparel? We expect to see displays of the fineries and futilities of dress in the drawing room, concert room, and places of amusement or entertainment. For they are worn for exhibition, and even in the street our American women have the vulgar pride of wearing apparel only suitable for indoors (and not always there) that when the house of God is made thus to minister to the weakest vanities—weakness because a rich dress is merely a matter of pure, and depends neither on cost, nor on brains, nor on rank, nor on station to protect. Vanity, snobbery, and silly rivalries are despicable anywhere, but in the church they are disgusting and should be intolerable. My, more, they are contrary to every rational idea of religious propriety. In the world people may look at the dress, but in the church God has to do with the heart; there is no distinction. But, here is the true idea of worship: a holy conversation is given to the adornment of the body that the needs of the soul? We have seen young ladies "join church," and in a soft voice "renounce the world," clothed as for the ball room rather than as a follower of "the meek and lowly Jesus," and pray for God to be "merciful to our miserable sinners" in toilets prepared at great cost of time and money for that very purpose. The glaring inconsistency of this course, pursued to a greater or less extent in all our churches on the Sabbath, is a mockery, and only a sorrowful reality, and we only wish that some of our leading women of position and wealth, true christian women, would after considering the matter seriously in its relations to God, their own hearts, and their fellow mortals, institute a reform.

WANTED TO BE HUNG.
The sentence of Connelly, who has for some time been awaiting death on the gallows for the murder of Mrs. Moore, having been commuted, has been commuted to State prison for life by Gov. McClure. He was to have been executed today. When the father communicated to him this last action of the Governor he became enraged and remarked: "This is the d—dest country on earth, and has the poorest laws. I have been living here in prison for months. My execution, for which everything has been made ready, has been twice put off, and now I am to go to the penitentiary for life, instead of being hung, as I wanted to be." He is evidently disappointed in not being permitted to meet death on the scaffold, having all the time since his incarceration expressed himself as desiring to be hung. A very large portion of the community think he should be accommodated. Every preparation has been made by Sheriff Orr for his execution; his coffin and all the paraphernalia of the murderer's death, at the hands of the law were ready. The scaffold was erected on the back of the Hackett, about one mile south of the town, in a secluded and lonely spot in the woods.
Yesterday morning, in charge of Deputy Sheriff Henry C. Keene, Connelly took his departure for the Penitentiary, still regretting that he could not be hung, instead of going to the State prison.—(Morning Star.)
