"I Have a Little Myself."

The New York World's Washington correspondent stands forth for the following statement as to the position of Gen. Grant on the reform movement: "A little less than a year ago several far-sighted Republican Members of Congress, who saw that these questions must be met half way by the Republican party, constituted themselves into a delegation, and called on the President to talk over the coming situation. For a moment he seemed quite impressed with the suggestion, and said: 'Yes, gentlemen, I think myself there ought to be a revision of the tariff; but we ought to proceed very cautiously, indeed. We ought to be very careful in touching those articles in which there is a great deal of capital invested. There is iron, for instance, pig-iron. Millions of dollars are invested in it. I have a little myself invested in iron, and Congress ought not to disturb the interest in it without weighing the consequences.' The delegation were so impressed with the parenthetical argument of the President that they did not deem it worth while to continue the conversation. The words of the President are given as nearly as the Republican member, who was present, can remember them." "General Grant may be in the same condition with reference to San Domingo. He may have a little invested in that movement, and hence the use of the navy, the usurpation of the 'kingly prerogative.'" - Age.

Can This be True.

A correspondent who seems to be perfectly informed respecting that which he affirms sends us the following surprising statement: "Major Isaac Lynde, father-in-law of Gen. Fred. Dent, President Grant's brother-in-law, now serving as principle usher at the White House, surrendered the Seventh Infantry to the rebels in Texas in the year 1861 and was immediately dismissed from the service by President Lincoln. "On the 28th of July, 1866, Gen. Grant procured from Andrew Johnson, with whom he was then on the best of terms, an order reinstating Lynde in the army and another order putting him on the retired list. There he is now, drawing pay as a retired military officer of the United States from the Government which he did his best to destroy. The records of the War Department will show how infamous Lynde's conduct was in this surrender. He was appointed by Grant and Johnson and retired on the same day."

Will not some independent member of Congress have the courage to investigate? And will not the country think that Grant carries his attachment to his relations rather too far when he imposes upon the taxpayers the necessity of providing for a military man who has betrayed his trust, simply because he is the father-in-law of his brother-in-law? - N. Loyal Rascality.

There is in the Senate at Washington a man named Lewis, from Virginia. He is one of those fellows who believe in forcing Radicalism upon the South no less than on the North. This is a pity that it was not applied to him during the war. The Washington correspondent writes of the Baltimore Gazette, thus speaks of him: "Of all the speeches recently made in either of the Houses of Congress, or in their secret conclaves, that of the scaly Lewis, of Virginia, delivered in the Senatorial caucus yesterday afternoon, was the most significant, the most truthful, and the most unpretentious. He briefly warned his fellow conspirators that 'if something was not at once done, that something decisive, there would be no Republican party in the South at all-black or white.' This touches the very marrow of the grave question at issue. The people of that down-trodden section, without regard to race or color, must be brought in to the support of the Radical cause, or all must be lost."

A Rare Martyr.

Among the victims of the Ku Klux, whose thrilling stories we have had dashed up in the Republican papers, is one Wm. Sturgis, ex-mayor of Meriden, Miss. It was told us in blood-curdling language that a loyal man was how he had been sacrificed in behalf of his bleeding country, and how he had been driven from the city of his abode for no other reason than that he had been true to the Union. Now comes the other side of the table, as given by the Mercury, a paper printed in the city of Meriden. It says: "The investigation which closed Thursday evening, and the testimony of which was all written down, has a chain of circumstantial evidence pointing so strongly to William Sturgis, late Mayor of Meriden, as to crowd out every other theory of the confederation. He stands out before the world as an incendiary and the founder of a riot in which a Judge was shot on the 1st of June, and personal attention, personal effort, and personal intervention, which he has bestowed upon his attempt to obtain half an island in the Caribbean sea, our Southern Ku Klux would have existed in name only, while tranquility would have reigned everywhere within our borders."
