At candidates for the county offices at ensuing Primary Election are numerous and multiplying every day, a selection of the right deferred to the people only, give it the most attention it deserves. I would like to say a word in behalf of the location and competency of the Committee party, many good men, however, can be found, who lack the essential qualifications for a district and the proper kind of a Commissioner. The office is an important one to the people, and to be sure, it requires the Commissioners to be a man of sound judgment, and of a man who has a sound and discriminating judgment, an experienced knowledge of business, and a general acquaintance throughout the country of the localities and their official importance. Every three years, in selecting the valuation of property, is a very difficult matter to one more than a committee of three, and especially where the different Assessors of each township are to be in the valuation of the property assessed. A comprehension of the great difficulty here would shield the present Commissioners from the many complaints of the people. In this case, the Commissioners will be in full charge of the property, and the present assessment and adjustment by the Commissioners is the most fair and just that has been in the twenty years past, though the property that I pay tax for is raised in valuation three times more than before.
