Grant managed it so that nught of this money thus collected at his own solicitation, \$65,000 went into his own pocket to pay for the house he had just before sold to Mr. Bowen for \$10,000; and thereupon Mr. A. T. Stewart, who had brought on the money and paid over to Grant the part of it which he choose to take for himself, was appointed by Grant to the office of Secretary of the Treasury. 
