BRICK WORKS.—It is now fully settled that we are to have five brick manufactories in our borough. Mr. A. H. Shaw has made a permanent lease of clay and ground where to erect buildings for the manufacture of five brick kilns. Mr. Henry Wile, of Philadelphia, and Mr. H. A. Richards, of Piquette, Schuylkill county, are the enterprising gentlemen who have determined to lead off. They understand the business, having been engaged in it for years, and possess the required capital, out of which they will make a fortune. They have entered into a contract with Mr. A. H. Shaw to erect a building 75 by 100 feet, and intend to use a sixty horse power engine to drive the machinery, besides giving employment to a large number of laborers, some of whom are already at work developing the clay, digging, etc. The proprietors design to purchase a plot of ground consisting in the vicinity, with a view of erecting twenty or thirty houses for the benefit of their employes.
