Within the past few years the old ideas in regard to many farm operations have been discarded, and new and more progressive ones taken their places. Not many years since it was almost the universal practice to bury all kinds of manures in the soil, as it comer from and Market streets, was thought that to leave them on the surface would cause a loss of the greater part of their valuable properties, which no doubt sometimes occurs with very volatile kinds of manure, when applied during leave to state that

Another old notion formerly quite prevalent among farmers was, that they required a large amount of coarse manures with heavy soils in order to make them light, porous, and congenial to the growths of plants; but this was only an exponsive substi-tute for subsoiling and under-draining, now so extensively practiced in all


