When first in-troduced into this country, there were no skilled workmen who understood the material, and consequently "tin men" were employed; they, not un-derstanding the nature of their mate-rial, used the zinc too thin, and soldered a roof up together in one piece, like a tea kettle; bence much of the modern objection to its use, which, however, is rapidly being overcome Its lightness is its great recommenda-tion; nobody doubts it being much cheaper as a uniterial for a roof than clead; but the public bave yet to be convinced that when judiciously emand General Mill Work, Sincemahoning, Camer ployed, under competent supervision, it is even more durable. 
