While the rattlesnake is found spread over a large portion of North America, it is much more abundant in some localities than in others. Texas probably holds an infinitely larger propor-tion of these reptiles than any other State in the Union. The district lying between the Rio Grande and the Nucces, two streams which flow in the same direction and some sixty or seventy miles apart, is a desert region, literally swarming with poisonous serpents. "In summer," says our writer, "one cannot go fifty yards in this locality without seeing a rattleenake. In other parts of the State the moccason is the prevalent snake; while centipedes, scorpions, tarrantu-ias, and aligators infest various locali-
