**The Feet.**  
Of all parts of the body there is not one which ought to be so carefully attended to as the feet. Every person knows from experience that colds and many other diseases that proceed from the same are attributable to cold feet. The feet are at such a great distance from the wheels of the system, that the circulation of the blood may be very easily checked in them. Yet, for all this, and although every person of common sense should be aware of the truth of what is here stated, there is no part of the body so much trifled with as the feet. The young and would-be genteel footed, cramp their feet into thin-soled, pointed-boots, in order to display neat feet, in the fashionable sense of the term. Now this is very wrong. In cold weather, boots of good thick leather, both in upper and sole, and large enough to give free circulation of the blood in the feet, should be worn by all. They should be water-tight and warm, but not air-tight.  
It injures the feet to wear an air-tight covering over them. India rubber shoes or boots should not be worn except in wet and slushy weather, and then taken off as soon as the exposure to its elements is over. In one body should be allowed to have a covering that entirely obstructs the passage of the carbonic acid gas from the pores of the skin outward and the moderate passage of the air inward to the skin. Life can be destroyed in a very short time by stopping these little pores of the skin. There is one great evil against which every person should be on guard, and that is one which is seldom guarded against, the changing of warm for cold boots or shoes. A change is often made from thick to thin-soled shoes, without reflecting upon the consequences which might ensue. It is a dangerous practice, and many an individual has suffered hours of illness because of it.

**The Solitary Twin.**  
The "Pat Contributor" furnishes the Utica Observer the following story of a twin:  
There was a woman out West who gave birth to one twin—just one, that all there was of him. She never had another solitary twin so long as she lived. He was a melancholy child from the first, and wore such a lonesome look. He always seemed to be watching and listening for somebody who never came. He appeared to realize that he wasn't all together; that he was a kind of human parenthesis with one bracket gone, animated dumb bells and one dumb bell missing, a "pair" that couldn't beat deuces and hardly worth drawing to. **Moloch in America.**—In Ohio a mound of a novel character has recently been cut through in order to make the approach to the Newton bridges near Cincinnati. It was evidently the debris of a huge sacrifice of children. A space twenty-five feet in diameter had been covered with an immense heap of wood, then it was set on fire, and the children were probably tossed into it one by one, as in the ancient sacrifice to Moloch. The heat was evidently intense and long continued, as the ground plainly showed the effects of violent conflagration. As soon as the sacrifice was completed and the fire had died out, the remains of the victims were all raked together in the center, and then the mound was raised in a very remarkable way. Soil was brought, apparently by different tribes from different localities, and each variety was carefully deposited by itself, so that the differences were clearly distinguishable. The remains collected consisted mostly of jaws and teeth of children. A pierced tooth of a rodent was found, which had evidently been used as an ornament. The remains will be placed in a museum at Plainville, Ohio.
