# Letter from Philadelphia.

PHILADELPHIA, June 21, 1858.

Wm. M. Breelin-Mr. Editor : You will have observed in the articles written on the "awakening," that Christianity was demonstrated to be philanthropic and aggressive .---"Christ illustrated this feature beautifully; when He said-

"For I was a hungared and ye gave me meat; I was thirsty and ye gave me drink; I was a stranger and ye took me in ; naked, and ye clothed me; I was sick, and ye visited me; I was in prison, and ye came unto me."

This is being practically developed now !. Our missions in Bedford and Baker streets. Mission schools in our suberbs, Magdalin Asylums, Homes for Friendless Children and Inchriates, all spring from this germinal point-"doing good and being finitiant in season and out of season. We have those self-sacrificing spirits with us, who deem this labor of love their meat and their drink to carry to the outcast, into the highways and in prison, the blessed overtures of mercy and head, as left to us in the death and sufferings of our risen Redeemer, and from them we learn this marvellous testimony, that the revival influence is brevailing, and from within our prison walls is resounding the song of deliverance. We glean rich fruits and realize fully the truth that "God is no respecter of persons, but looketh at the heart."

Our Penitentiany, as you are aware, is conducted on the solitary confinement principle ; socially there is no access. In this day walls are no bar to the troubled soul. When the Union meetings were held in the small room of Jayne's Hall, a petition was sent in from one of the prison inmates, "in much concern for his soul." The fervency of the appeal was answered from on high and the prisoner became spiritually free. He realized, in the depths of his gratitude to Him who dolivered him, that his work had but begun, and now the Master desired his thank offering in return-he desired to present a soul as his offering, and sought out his neighbor. Knocking at the wall of the adjoining cell, he commenced his work at once, unfolding to him Jesus as his Deliverer-His mercy and condescension in plucking the brand from the burning, and his readiness to save even unto the uttermost all who call upon Him ! The conversation attracted the at-tention of his keeper and it was forbidden as in violation of the rules. But his yearsings rested not. a ventilator led from his cell through his neighbors, and through this, on bended knee, he poured his soul-an answer came : "Oh ! pray for me !" An earnest appeal went up, and now both are happy in believing, and, though bound, their souls drink in sweetness from that infinite Source of Good, who bringeth light into our darkness, and bids our burdened souls be of "Good cheer" "I am with you even unto the end." The building is constructed so as to diverge from a centre into gang ways, the cells being arranged in tiers, each gangway constituting a ward. In the 3d and 7th wards some 12 have been found under deep conviction and some few honefully converted to God. Among these, there is one remarkable case. A young man who but a year ago knew not his alphabet, now intimate. ly conversant with the scriptures, able rapidly to quote therefrom, and rejoicing in the full assur-

ance of a blessed immortality. Looking forward to his release, only, that he may herald the glad tidings of salvation, as a minister of the gospel, to fallon humanity. The wardon says that he is a remarkable man, and of the genuineness of his profession, expresses not a doubt. Such, my for sale in Neb friends, is the work which we have been endeav oring feebly to portray to you and give you words of encouragement, to labor and not faint. We have observed the gradual growth until its convincing power has been every where felt to be the work of God. What seemed but as a cloud of a hand-breath-now covers the horizon, and the prospects are that this shall roll on until the millenial sun shall shine upon us in all its brightness; when peace shall be universal, the spirit assuming its sway, the kingdom of darkness yielding to the victorious shout of our High Priest-the "Conqueror !" "Wait upon the Lord, and He shall renew your strength !" And now let me encourage you to go on in the example of one fixed in the assurance that in Him you are safe. "Out of dust. God is a consuming fire !" On the 17th of June, 1857, a vessel put into the port of Baltimore, the same day a man fell from the mast into the hold, and was picked up dead. 
