Correspondence of the Lebanon Advertiser. Letter from Philadelphia.

PHILADELPHIA, June 21, 1886. 'You will have observed in the articles written on the "awakening," that Christianity was demonstrated to be philanthropic and aggressive. Christ illustrated this feature beautifully when He said: "For I was hungry and ye gave me meat; I was thirsty and ye gave me drink; I was a stranger and ye took me in; naked, and ye clothed me; I was sick, and ye visited me; I was in prison, and ye came unto me." This is being practically developed now. Our missions in our suburbs, Magdalen Asylums, Homes for Friendless Children and Inebriates, Mission for the germinal point—"doing good and being good" in season and out of season. We have these self-sacrificing spirits with us, who have their labor of love and their drink to carry to the outcast, into the highways and in prison, the blessed overtures of mercy and head, as left to us in the death and sufferings of our risen Redeemer, and from them we learn this marvellous testimony, that the revival influence is prevailing, and from within our prison walls is a resounding cry of deliverance. We glad wish fruits and realize fully the truth that "God is no respecter of persons, but looketh at the heart."

Our Religion, as you are aware, is conducted on the ordinary common principle; socially there is no exception. In this day of ours there is no truce to the troubled soul. When the Union meetings were held in the small room of Jarvis Hall, a petition was sent in from one of the prisoners, "in much concern for his soul." The fervency of the appeal was answered from on high and the prisoner became spiritually free. He realized, in the depths of his gratitude to Him who delivered him, that his work had begun, and now the Master desired his thank offering in return, to be desired to present a soul as his offering, and sought out his neighbor. Knocking at the wall of the adjoining cell, he commenced his work at once, unfolding to him Jesus as his Deliverer—His mercy and compassion in placing the light of the morning, and his readiness to save even unto the uttermost all who call upon Him. The conversation attracted the attention of his keeper, and it was forbidden as "in violation of the rules." But his yearnings rested not, a ventilator led from his cell through his neighbors, and through this, on bended knee, he poured his soul—an answer came: "Oh! pray for me!" An earnest appeal went up, and now both are happy in believing, and though bound, their souls drink in sweetness from that infinite Source of Good, who brings light into our darkness, and bids our burdened souls be of "Good cheer," "I am with you even unto the end."

The building is constructed so as to diverge from a center into gang ways, the cells being arranged in tiers, each gangway containing a friend in the morning, and give you words of encouragement, to labor and not faint. We have observed the gradual growth until its controlling power has been every where felt to be the work of God. What seemed but as a cloud of a hand—bread—now covers the horizon, and the prospects are that this shall roll on until the million sun shall shine upon us all in its brightness, when peace shall be universal, the spirit assuming its sway, the kingdom of darkness yielding to the victorious shout of our High Priest—the "Conqueror." "Wait upon the Lord, and He shall renew your strength." And now let me encourage you to go on in the example of one fixed in the assurance that in Him you are safe. "Out of the deep I have cried, and thou hast answered me, O God in the 17th of June, 1887, a vessel put out to the port of Baltimore, the same day a man fell from the mast into the hold, and was picked up dead. A gentleman who stood by said, "he had not time to say, 'Lord be merciful to me a sinner,'" so instantaneous was the transition. The coroner's duty over the trunk was transferred to his care, and now thought he, we will see this stranger is. On opening his chest the first object they found was a Bible, from appearances well read, a hymn book, and in his log-book, these memorable words, written that day—"I left my mother some 16 years ago in Stockholm. I may never see the land of my birth again, but I am sure I shall meet her in Heaven. I do not regret, I have no regret in praying, 'God be merciful to me a sinner!'" God bless him as a lamb in his arms, and be now rest his labors. I would say to all, be ye also ready.
