MATRIMONIAL BROKERAGE IN NEW YORK In the Supreme Court of New York, on Tues. day, the case of Robert G. Nellis against George Cronse and Ann Crouse, was heard, being a suit to recover \$1000 for helping Ann to a husband. The Tribune says of the matter.

This is one of the most curious cases that has been before the Court in many years. The plaintiff in his complaint alleges that Ann Eliza Crouse, in April, 1855, was a widow lady, unmarried, residing in this city, possessed of ample fortune and means, good physical health and bodily vigor, good reputation and of an amorous and affectionate disposition, and being fired of her lonely way of Rving, and desirous of obtaining a good husband, whom she could love and honor, applied to him (plaintiff) to obtain for her a suitable husband, promising that if he would make her acquainted with some man of good character, and a fortune equal or nearly equal to thers, and if she married the man so presented, she would pay plaintiff the sum of \$1000. In pursuance of this agreement, plaintiff procured John Cummings, of Cansjoharie, Montgomery county, this State, to come to the city; but it applaint states that she did not marry him.—
Plaintiff next induced a "soger" from Sazatoga county to come to the city—a Major Freeman, who was introduced to Ann Eliza. After a long courtship, the contemplated engagement with him was broken off and she did not marry Freeman. Plaintiff intending that Ann Eliza should have what she so much wanted, a husband, and that he (plaintiff) should receive what he so much needed, the sum of \$1,000, procured his kinsman, the said Geo. Crouse, who then resided in Madison county, to come to the city, where he was introduced to Ann Eliza, and subsequently, in the Spring of 1858, married her. The Judge took the papers, and reserved his




