The cornerstone of St. Paul Catholic Church, at Reading, was laid on Sunday afternoon, with the usual solemn and interesting ceremonies of the Roman-Catholic Church, by the Right Rev. J. P. Wood, Bishop of the Diocese of Pennsylvania.
