The first pioneer of Ohio did not settle until twenty years after this time. A hundred years ago, there were but four newspapers in America-steem engines had not been imagined, and railroads and telegraphs had not entered into through the vista of history, we find that to the century which has passed, has been allotted more important events, in their bearing upon the happiness of the world, than almost any other which has elapsed since the creation.




