Important Decisions of the Internal Revenue Commissioner.-The Commissloner of Internal Revenue has decidted that the ordinary acknowledgment by the grantor of a deed before a juctice of the peace, notary public or other officer. is exempt from stamp duty. The ordinary form of affidavit before a justice of the peace, or other officer authorized to administer oaths, is liable to stamp duty of five cents, the juret affixed by the officer being held to be a certificate.

A detachment, of seventy thousand of our war veterans might march through the whole heart of the country without rerious impediment. The mother country would be powerless to prevent it.


