Sin:—Yours of the 9th inst is received. The question as to who shall pay the duty required on receipts on any summof money exceeding \$20, is dependent on the circumstances at tending the case.

Ordinarily at law no person is bound to give a receipt for money paid. This receipt is an instrument of evidence useful only to the person to whom it is given.—If he needs a receipt it is necessary for him to furnish the Stamp or to stamp the receipt, if required, before it is signed. The person who receives the money is not obliged to give a receipt unless the other party furnishes the proper stamp.

If a person gives a receipt without requiring that the party to whom it is given shall furnish the stamp, the maker of the receipt must himself stamp, the upager before he delivers: It file is liable to the penalty provided by law for the omission, but the other party may stamp it mind lately upon its being received.
