The public debt statement for November last shows a decrease of \$4,679,015.

The Treasury Department will sell \$500,000 in gold on each Thursday of November, or a total of \$3,000,000 during the month.

The Secretary of the Treasury on Monday issued the twenty-fifth call for the redemption of \$10,000,000 United States bonds of 1864, \$5,000,000 of coupon bonds and \$5,000,000 of registered.

The election in this county last Tuesday resulted in the choice of the entire Democratic county ticket, by majorities ranging from 67 to 403.

It is intimated by a telegram from Washington that the questions arising from the continuance of the insurrection in Cuba may compel some action by the United States.

Returns from New York put a somewhat different face upon things in that state, and make it probable or possible that the Democratic State ticket has been elected by a small majority.

Three hundred and thirty-two cities and towns in Massachusetts give Rice 82,900; Gaston, 77,809; Baker, 8941; Adams, 1774.

Complete returns from New Jersey show that the Republicans have elected 37 members of the Assembly and the Democrats 23. The Republican majority on joint ballot will be 17, against a Democratic majority of 17 on joint ballot last year.

The repudiation by Turkey of half of its debt has created great excitement among English capitalists.

The latest returns from Wisconsin indicate the election of the whole Republican State ticket by from 2000 to 5000 majority. The Republicans will probably have a majority of 30 in the Legislature on joint ballot.

The latest returns from Mississippi indicate that the Democrats have carried nearly every county in the State, and that they have elected all the Congressmen, except possibly in the Sixth District. They claim 6 or 8 majority in the State Senate, and 30 in the House.

Founder's Day at Lafayette.

The faculty of Lafayette College having resolved that "hereafter the Wednesday following the 21st day of October, in each year, be recognized as the anniversary of the founding and gift of Pardee Hall, and that it be set apart forever by Lafayette College, its Faculty, and students, under the name of Founder's Day, as a day of commemoration of the founder, Ario Pardee," the usual college exercises were suspended on the 21st, and the day was celebrated by the Faculty and students and friends of the college.

The Christian Women and College Mills, formerly known as Briner's Mills, situated and Hamilton streets, in Philadelphia, were recently destroyed by fire.

Gov. Ames Walker died suddenly at North Brookfield, Mass., Friday of last week, aged 78 years.

The National Gold Bank and Trust Company of New York has given its voluntary liquidation under the provisions of the National Banking law.

At Portland, Me., on Saturday, the Eastern Railroad was wrecked in such a manner as to require to reconstruct the bridge in a direction opposite to that in which the passenger was traveling.

Arrangements have been inaugurated at Cincinnati for a centennial religious celebration to be held in that city next year.

Over 100 track laborers on the Hudson River Railroad, between New York and Albany were discharged Monday. Further discharges are expected.

On the 29th of the month, a severe storm which prevailed on Sunday, about seven persons lost their lives at St. Paul, Ind. The storm was principally due to the fact that the wind was from the west, and the water was from the east.
