John W. Johnson, District Attorney at Lancaster, Pa., was arrested Monday and held for a hearing to day, Saturday, on the charge of having issued fraudulent naturalization papers in 1873.

Josephus Sooty, Jr., late Treasurer of New Jersey, was arraigned for sentence in Trenton Monday for the embezzlement of \$47,000. Chief Justice Bessley said: "The fact of your being here at this time, convicted of such a crime, is a shock not only to the Court but to the community."

The End of the World. A meeting of Second Adventists was held on Sunday in Cooper Union, New York City, to discuss the prophecy of the coming of Christ in 1876.

Mr. Jerris, who had written on a blackboard some figures to show that the end of the world, or "the time of the end," will come this year, spoke about the fulfillment of the prophecy in the twelfth chapter of Daniel.

Two or three other persons spoke, and one old man criticised the churches for not preaching the coming of Christ. Col. Forney's Centennial Address. Says the Harrisburg Patriot: Colonel Forney arrived by the fast line Tuesday from Philadelphia about 5 p. m., accompanied by a "centennial committee."

The hall of the house was crowded long before the hour announced for the appearance of the distinguished speaker. The speaker's desk was handsomely festooned with flags, and a creditable floral display was laid in honor of the occasion.

Senator Jones, of the reception committee, introduced the different speakers and made a short but interesting speech, as follows: Mr. Jones said: MR. The latest returns from New Hampshire indicate that Cheney's (Rep.) majority will be 3000, that the Republicans will have 45 Councillors, 9 of the 12 Senators, and 25 to 30 majority in the House. Returns from 234 towns give Cheney a majority of 3347. Ten towns, which gave a vote of 1100 last year, are yet to be heard from.

The Inter-Ocean says it is announced unofficially that Wilbur F. Storey is about to dispose of forty-nine hundredths of his interest in the Chicago Times newspaper for the sum of \$500,000. The purchasers are announced to be Cyrus H. McCormick, Perry H. Smith, F. H. Winston, and certain Eastern individuals—all Democrats of the most pronounced stripe.

A Washington dispatch of the 15th inst., says the entire expense of the whisky trials in St. Louis is reported to the Department of Justice to have been \$70,000. Ex-Senator Henderson gets \$23,000, and Col. Broadhead and Major Eaton each \$10,000, making the total expense of special counsel \$42,000.

The tornado in Northwestern Missouri on Friday evening demolished the village of Scribner in Missouri, killing 10 persons and injuring twenty. At Kirwin Station, on the Missouri, Kansas and Texas Railroad, 100 children have been carried off by the gusts and have not been found.
