A h beaut storm of rein accompanied by vivid fleshes of lightning add terrific pe ly of thunder, presing over the valley between 3 & 3, they were compelled to seek shelter, which they obtained by entering an unencupied building, through the windows. In this place they remained until the stars had passed, when they proceeded to the farm of Mr. Amos Reifel, over which Mr. 2 mini E. Fritz has been placed as manager or superintendent, and con exced to gother cherries from the trees, without asking permissionfrom anyone. Being observed by Mr. Fritz, he armed bisself with a gun and proceeded to the apot. Arriving there he ordered than to desist from picking observies and to leave the p premises, which they all appeared to do with the exception of one Names Burks, or Burke Reilly, on he is called, - young many out 20 or 21 yrs. of age, whol loitered on the tree, and, on finally coming down, became shusive to Fritz and commenced to throw stones at his, shereuson Fritz went up to him and struck him with his gun alongside the head. Burke then cenched to his pocket and exclaimed: "Dama you, Itll shoat YEu!" when Fritz, bulieving his own life in danger, fired the contents of his gun at the lower extremities of Burks; but the latter stooping, as he supposed to dodge the shat, received the load in his nack. He staggered to and over the fence into the road, where, sitting down, he attempted to take off his cost, but fell over dead before he could accomplish it. Fritz ahm want to his house, but shorly raturned and surrendered bimself to a Justice of the Peace. A coroner's jury was ampeoneled, end, aft r hearing the testimony, rendered the following verdict: "That decrased was shot by Daniel E. Frtiz in self-defense."
