

Preparing Fruit for Market. "Farmers are cheats," we heard a city man remark the other day. "I do not bey a basket of fruit that has not the best as d bi gest on top, and when the peach season coues, I get a dozen or two fine peaches at the top, while the rest of the basket is fil ed with smull, green and gnarled fruit; they are all cheats." The very next day after hearing the remark; we were among the fruit commission houses, and in one place saw some young men, who had put chused several crates of berries to peddle They had a lot of smaller baskets, to which hey transferred the berries from the larger ones they had bought, and as they filled theze, they topped them with the largest erries with surprising dexerity. We conluded that all the chesting, instrawberrie t least, was not done by the farmers. That there is such "desconing" (the market ph ase for topping) of peaches and other fruits, we do not doubt, yet the tendency i all in the other direction. Take peach growers, for example, those who are regu larily in the business, and expect to con tique it, strive to make their brand up n ate or basket a guarantee of honest pack og. Tols is insisted upon at all the mee: ngs of peach growers; only recently we re ceived the transactions of a fruit grower society, in North Carolina, in which the point, honest packing, was dwell upon a great length. "Honesty is the best policy, is not a proverb of the highest moral tone as it implies that it pays to be honest, bu the peach growers are willing to adopt it In packing peaches, the first point should on to assort them, making as many gradas the condition of the fruit requires. Whe brought to the packing shed, the truit is a once thinly spread in the shade, in order that it may cool as much as possible. In assorting, any that are at all soft are poaside, to be left at home; then two or thre ualities, extrus, firsts and seconds, ar nade, and with the best growers, the pack ares of each are alike throughout. It is al lawable to turn the co'ored sides of the to layers uppermost, in order that the frui nay appear at its best, but not to select large specimens for the top layer.
