

There are three modes of dealing with veeds on farms: 1, allowing them frerange-a common and bad way; 2, struggling against them with partial success. This treatment is very common even among many good farmers. It will do for some weeds which are not f rmidable, such as mmon grass in a corn field. With other woods, such as Canada thistle, it is expen sive. As with a fire in a city, it is cheaper to make thorough work and not to leav any vestige to break out again. Hence I many cares it is better to adopt a third mode, and effect a clean sweep. to hold before readers that spreading weeds sannet be wholly extirpated. It tends to puintain and perpetuate loose practices. I s asserted that Canada thisties "have stendly increased, even on farms where all the ales for their destruction have been faithfully observed." I have no doubt the farmers have tried to observe these rules. but between old habits and such obstructions as stumps and stones, there has been failure. Let me cite a few examples:

A few miles from my residence is a form f over one hundred seres. The owner did not believe that Canada thistles could be killed, and he accordingly did not "weste" needles labor to destroy them. He let them have their own way, and gradually the whole farm was nearly covered. That farm became noted for its broad crop of these thistles. It then fell into new hands and was subjected to a new treatment. The manager did not adopt the long interval practice of allowing thistles to get some seadway between the plowings. He pot them completely under and made them stay there. Fences were removed so that all the thistles could be reached. I offer pass that farm now, but I see no thistles o it. I killed a patch of an acre of Canadthistles in one season, and none ever can iterward. In another year I thoroughly estroyed another patch of five acres. ave known the thing done so often that s hardly necessary to multiply statements heground was such as to admit of unbroke lowing. Among rocks and stumps night be impracticable. I have known of ome farmers who asserted that they trie t and failed, but I found on examinatio hat they pursued the half slip shod course : Howing some weeds to peop between plan sign. I have seen a large field of quacgrass completely cleared in one sesson but t was done by thorough work, which is al ways the cheapest. I have seen two farm in the midst of a country white with oxes daisy, and on these two farms not a plan of this weed could be found. The thoroug system pursued was not a costly one. T e poor, slip shod way. Thorough, fi e sulverigation and close work is what is wanted on all-summer fallows. -Acas.

Paraley in Winter. It is very easy to have a supply of paraey all winter. Take up the plants from the garden, cut off all but a few small leaves at the centre of the tuft, and plant them is box of good soil. Another method is, to take a keg-a nail keg will answere; bor umerous inch or inch and a half holes in its sides. Place the paraley with the crown at the holes and the roots extending heri ontally into the keg, gradually filling is with earth to hold them in place. The residents of cities who have no gardens, can buy paraley for this purpose in the markets. s it is usually sold with the roots attached Those who are fond of parsley as a season ng, and do not care to be at the trouble o mising it as above, may dry it readily and find it above as good as when fresh. Spread the leaves thinly on a pan; when the stoy even is not very hot, place this in it, and leave the door open. The paraley will dry very quickly; as soon as it is crisp, rub between the hands into a powder, which a be kept in bottles, tightly closed .- Amer can Agriculturist.
