

The Propagation of House Plants Nothing about plant culture is more fas

sinsting than the multiplying of plants om cuttings. It is the making of a new plant, and one takes all the more interest n a plant thus produced. Florists, with their propagating benches, turn out plants by hundreds and thousands. Their propagating houses are regular plant factories, in which the raw material of cuttings, is turn ed out as the finished product-the moted plants. Several years ago we published a method by which the amateur could multi ply his plants in all needed numbers, and with something like the certainty that at tends the larger operations of the florist The method alluded to is known as "the sancer system," and, as it will be new to large number of our readers, we give it in orial. The outfit needed is sharp sand-if from the sea shore, let it be thoroughly washed, to deprive it of all salt-and a saucer, soup plate or other dish, that will hold an inch in depth of sand. Cuttings are made of the tender growth of house plants, an inch or two long, and set in the sand so closely together as to touch one another. The dish of sand containing the cuttings; should be set in a sunny window fully expected to the light and the sand. from the beginning must be "sopping wet," and kept in the state of mud continously If the sand is allowed to get dry, most of the cuttings will be lost. Some cuttings will be rooted in a week, others in two or three weeks. As soon as roots are formed at the base, the cuttings should be potted off in rich, light soil. Shrubs that do not root readily from cuttings of the ripened stem, will often grow readily in the sauce it a tender shoot be taken. - American Agri Producing New Varieties of Potatoes.

The tubers will sometimes, though rarely sport," and produce a different variety from the one planted, giving the impression that they will "mix in the hill." The only way to be certain of producing new arieties, is to plant the real seeds, thes ound in the fruit or "ball," that succeeds the flowers at the top of the vine. Each seed in a ball may produce a distinct vari ety. Why Farmers Fail to Raise Melons. Many between in the more Northern stea fail in the modern man The true row, blossom, and hear fruit perhaps, he t or small and poor in quality, often und or cattle feed. This frequently occurs in the same locality, and on the same kind of oil, where a skill ful gardener rames melon of good sezs and finest flavor. No doubt clous can be grown more easily in a south ern than in a northern climaterbut it is true of this crop, as of many others, that I reaches its highest excellence in the north ern limits of the belt where it will matur-For example, the Valley of the Connection River, especially in Hartford county, i somewhat famous for its fine watermelers There, as in some other localitites, the fac! my for marketing them by a near navigable stable coop. But certain it is, the sind linvium abounding in that valley is ad mirably adapted to melons. A comme eque of failure with this crop is the lack of sufficient manure. One puts a shovelful f monute under the seed, without care le the rest of the ground where the tools are t penetrate and reck most of their tood. The nelons are gross feeders, and require much water to supply the abundant juices and large evaporation from their extensive lead arthus, whole the northern season is nontoo long for them. They grow with great rapidity in hos weather, and the most much be made of the summer months, by supply ing them with all the field they can upper priate; it should be broad-casted with plent; of well rofted stable manure, and plowe as long before planting as possible, that i may be we'l aiffused through the re-Early in August we visited a garden wher the melon patch, about a quarter sere, ha received twelve cartlends of manure, o about a half cord each. The melons ap parenty never suspected they were no growing in the tropics. There were plenty of them, and of Classabas, and Nutmegs. beautiful to the eye, and melting upon the palate. There is great satisfaction in rais ing fruits periect after their kind, only por mole in northern elimates, with abundan manure. - WM. Clarr, in Am. Agriculturist.
