

In this connection the word "art" 7 00 means the process or method of produc-ing an old or new result. If a method of doing anything contains one or more new steps, the process is new and patent

nble.
The word "machine" means any device or thing by means of which i mechanical result may be produced, such as a pin, a churn, or a locomotive The word "manufacture" means a clothing, harness, and the thousands of things which are offered for sale. "Com position of matter" means a chemica compound of ingredients, such as hard rubber, liquid glue, medicine, etc. Patents may also be obtained for designs for manufactures and works of art, for three, seven, and ten years. Trade marks may be registered for
