THE FORM OF THE OFFICIAL BALLOT.

A Facsimile of it as properly marked by a voter intending to vote a STRAIGHT DEMOCRATIC ticket. This is not an official ballot and cannot be used in voting.

A Cross (X) marked in the square at the right of the party appellation at the head of a Group of Candidates indicates a vote for all the candidates in such group.

A Cross (X) marked in the square at the right of the Name of a Candidate indicates a vote for that candidate.

The reader should not forget that the Marks (X) which appear as shown below are not upon the ballot when it is taken by the voter, but indicate how he is to place the marks upon it in order to vote. The names given are not those of the candidates.
