

MAKING OF THE TELEGRAPH. The Atlantic Telegraph is broken, and the operations for the present are suspended.

London, Saturday, Aug. 15, A. M.—Majesty's steamer Leopard arrived at Southampton on Friday, the 14th inst., and that the Atlantic cable was lost at 4 o'clock on Tuesday morning the 11th inst., after having paid out 355 nautical miles, and the 100 miles of it in water over two miles depth, and the greater part of this at the rate of more than four knots an hour.

The Niagara was going at the rate of four knots per hour, and the crew found that the cable was running at a great proportion to the speed of the ship, he considered it necessary to disengage the brakes to be applied more firmly, and unfortunately the cable parted at a distance from the stern of the ship.

The Cyclops was sent back with despatches to Valentia, and then to join the Leopard at Portsmouth.
