Yeast for Cakes or Bread.—In a gallon of boiling water, stir sufficient white yeast to make a smooth thick lather which stir in it 4 ounces white sugar and 2 ounces yeast (say near a teaspoonful) to the mass to ferment. Lay it by in a covered jar for use. Half a teaspoonful enough to make two large loaves. The new yeast when used up, resists the cupful.

To Clean and Restore Black Laces.

Wash the lace around a rolling-pin, fasten it with some black thread. Then wash the lace with great care in a gentle hand; rinse away the soap with clean, milk-warm water; then let it dry. Next day make some good tea—black tea is best—and dissolve in it a little gum arabic, using about as much as one would sugar, if it was to drink. Now rinse the lace in this tea several times. The tea, or rather the rinsing principle contained therein, will impart the color of the lace, while the gum arabic will stiffen it.

Whence Comes the Cut Worm?

The query of your Correspondent in the January Agriculturalist, is answered by saying that the cut worm comes from the egg laid by an ash colored miller, which butterfly, which ever you please to call it, is about an inch in length, and two inches, and legs about five-eighths of an inch long. The whole appearance of the insect is much like a magnificent caterpillar without his proboscis.

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
