Artificial Honeycombs.

Some ingenious bee man in Germany has invented a method of making artificial honeycomb, which he puts into hives in which new swarms of bees are to be put. This is found to be quite an improvement. The bees find their new quarters already partly filled with unfinished comb and they soon finish it up and fill it with honey. Thus both time and labor are saved to the bee, and he is made to return honey in less time than if such a start had not been given him.
