out and put it where you can find it. A surveyor's chain is 4 poles; or 76 feet divided into a 100 links. 792 inches.

A square chain is 16 square poles, and 10 square chains is an acre.

Four roods are an acre, each containing 1,210 square yards.

A pole is 5½ yards each way.

An acre is 4,840 square yards or 69 yards, 1 foot 81 inches each way.

A square mile, 1,760 yards each way is 640 acres; half mile, or 880 yards each way, is 160 acres; a quarter of a mile or 440 yards each way, is a park or farm of me forty acres; and a furlong, or 220 yards each way, is 10 acres.

Inducing Fruit Bearing.

'An old subscriber' writes, 'I have tried with most gratifying success a method of promoting fertility in trees, which was suggested to me in the Agriculturist. I have a large Bartlett pear tree which has persisted year by year in making the most rampant growth, but which refused to do its duty in the more important matter of fruit bearing. In July last year, I took a stout cord and bound it as tightly as possible, three or four times around the trunk of the tree, and left it there until November. The result is that this year my tree had about three hundred large, fine looking pears upon it, so loading it down that I had to prop up several of the branches to prevent their breaking. The tree at the same time has made a strong, healthy growth of about six inches.



Lemon Pie .- Beat with yolks of four ggs, two teaspoonfuls of melted butter, four of white sugar, the juice and grated rind of two lemons. Put into a rich paste and bake. Then beat the whites to a froth, adding two teaspoonfuls of powdered sugar; spread on the pies when done; put them in the oven and bake again for three minutes. The above is for two pies.


Beef Pie .- Make a nice crust a little richer than for biscuit; chop up the pieces of the boiled round of beef, when you have them cold; season with salt, pepper and butter, and onions if you like, line a basin with crust rolled about half an inch thick, fill with beef moistened with gravy or water; dredge in a little flour; cover, bake half an hour.

Oil for the Hair .- Oil of hen, one pint, civet, three grains, Italian oil of jasmin, three fluid ounces, ottar of roses, three minims. If ottar of roses is not to be had, 10 or 12 minims of common oil may be substituted. This oil strengthens and improves the hair, makes it curl, and gives it a beautiful gloss.


