Anderson-Yes; and only on those. Wigfall then returned. Ten minutes after, Col. Chesnut and others came from Beauregard, asking if Major An-derson wanted any help, and stated that Gen. Wigfall had not seen Gen. Reauregard for two days, and had no authority for his de-mand on Anderson? Major Anderson replied: Then we have been sold. We will raise our flag again. But they requested him to keep it down un-til communication was had with Beauregard.

til communication was had with Beauregard. The firing then ceased, and three hours after another deputation came to the fort.--The terms previously decided upon were then agreed to.

On Sunday morning the steamer Isabel came down, and anchored off the fort, when all our baggage was put on board the steamor Clinch, which was used as a transport be-tween the fort and the Isabel. Our men were still under arms.

A portion of the men were told to fire off a salute to the flag, and when the last of the 50 guns were fired, the flag was lowered amid the loud and hearty cheers of the men, who then formed in a gorge, and embarked to the tune of "Yankee Doodle." Two men were killed, on the second round of the salute, by a premature explosion of the gun, and four were wounded-one badly. They were left at Charleston.

On Monday we steamed down the harbor, and were transferred to the Baltic, sailing on Tuesday morning. Fort Sumter has not been reinforced on any

occasion.

Flight of Northern Men from Virginia .-By the train on Friday night between sixty and seventy persons-men, women and chil-dren-reached New York who were compelled and seventy persons—men, women and children-reached New York who were compelled to leave Virginia on account of entertaining Union sentiments. A majority of these per-sons are from Norfolk and Richmond, where some of them leave considerable property, some of them leave considerable property, which they now consider worthless to them. They represent that there are a great many Union people in Virginia, but they are over awed by the secessionists, who, maddened by liquor, are ready to execute summary pun-ishment upon all who differ with them. New England men are particularly obnoxious to the rebels, and it is not considered safe for any Northern man to remain there.
