THE PRISONERS .- A correspondent of the Bellefonte Central Press gives a detailed account of the capture of a portion of Captain Hess's company, from which we noon. take the following particulars:

The army commenced crossing at Williamsment, with the regular cavalry and a battery ment, with the regular cavalry and a battery under command of Capt. Perkins, U. S. A., taking the advance. Gen. Negley's Brigade and another closely supported them. As they marched on Gen. Negley's Brigade was sent towards the right, and detailing I of the Fifteenth Pa Rag. they could have independent advanced. eenth Pa, Reg., they sent them in advance to skirmish and reconnoiter. At about half-past seven o'clock this company was surprispany of rebel cavalry, one hundred strong, under command of Captain Hoge, of this place. Captain Hess, of Potters Mills, com-mands the company, and at the time of this unfortunate casualty was with them. I enclose a list of those among the captives who belong to our portion of the country, the corectness of which may be relied on, as it was procured from the Captain and the remaining members of the company. were dressed in the uniform of the U. S. reg-ular cavalry, and they evidently endeavored to be taken for friends, in which, unfortunately, they were entirely successful. Capt Hess, having his suspicions aroused, suggested to Lieut. Smith the propriety of a halt, as they were then nearly half a mile ahead of the regiment, but he felt perfectly confident that no enemy was near. Lieut. Hutchison and his party was neither seen nor heard from after they entered the woods.

It is surmised that part of the Secession cavalry concealing first their horses and then themselves, awaited at proper points the advance of the different pairs, and presenting their revolvers, made any attempt at resistance or alarm, certain death. About fifty of the cavalry now rode out into the field and leisurely, as though they were friends, approached the men in the centre. Capt. Hess had now become so suspicious of danger, that he went to the right, and directed Lieut. Hoskins to halt. Just then the cavalry approached the men in the road, and they, seeing the U. S. on their belts, exclaimed, 'Here's some of our boys,' and two of them throwing down the bars welcomed their treacherous foes to their midst.
