6. Use the oil of hickory freely, whenever your oxen need strength ; it is cheap-er than hay or meal, keeps the hair lively and pounds out all the grubs.

7. Select such calves for stock as the butchers shun; beauties of runts, thin in the hams and pot-bellied; but be sure and keep their blood thin by scanty herbage; animals are safest to breed from that haven't strength to herd.

Be cautious in the manufacture of manure; it makes the fields look black and mournful about planting time; besides it is a deal of work to baulit.

9. Never waste time in setting out fruit and leaves rotting around a place makes it unhealthy.


