THE douberelego.

RECIPES.

A Plain, Cheap, and Good Cake .-Rub & pound of butter into I pound of fine flour; and 4 oz, of moist sugar, 1 pound of currants, & pound of raisins, 2 oz. of candied peel, shred fine, a pinch of nutmeg and salt. Mix well one tablespoonful of carbonate of soda in half a pint of cold milk; pour these on to the other ingredients and beat them into a paste. Butter a tin, and line the sides and bottom with buttered writing paper; drop in the dough without allowing it to rise, and bake for some hour and a half in a moderate oven.

Nice Soda Cake .- One pound flour, quarter pound ground rice, half pound currants, half pound butter, half pound sugar, quarter pound candied peel, and a teaspoonful earbonate soda. Mix with half a pint of cold milk and two eggs Bake two hours.

Milk Lemonade - Dissolve three quarters of a pound of loaf sugar in one pint of boiling water, and mix with one gill of lemon juice, and one gill of sherry; then add three gills of cold milk. Stir the whole together, and strain it.

Wine Cakes .- Half pound butter, half flour, three quarters pound sugar, and two eggs; beat well together, and drop upon tins with a teaspoon. A few chopped almonds is a great improvement.
