Important Report from the Joint Committee of Congress on Reconstruction. The Joint Committee on Reconstruction, by a vote of 12 to 3, have agreed to report the following proposition:

Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, that the following article be proposed to the Legislatures of the several States as an amendment to the Constitution...

Article—Section 1. No State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property without due process of law...

Whereas, It is expedient that the States lately in insurrection should, at the earliest day consistent with the future peace and safety of the Union, be restored to full participation in all political rights...

of the Constitution, and any State lately in insurrection shall have ratified the same, and shall have modified its constitution and laws in conformity therewith...

A Bill Declaring Certain Persons Unfit to Hold Office under the Government of the United States. Be it enacted, etc., That no person shall be eligible to any office under the Government of the United States...

1st. The President and Vice President of the Confederate States of America, so called, and heads of departments thereof.

2d. Those who in other countries acted as agents of the Confederate States of America, so called.

3d. Heads of departments of the United States, officers of the army and navy of the United States, and all persons educated at the Military or Naval Academy of the United States...

4th. Those who acted as officers of the Confederate States of America, so called, above the head of a colonel in the army or master in the navy...

5th. Those who acted as officers of the Confederate States of America, so called, above the head of a colonel in the army or master in the navy...

6th. Those who have treated officers or soldiers or sailors of the army or navy of the United States, captured during the late war, otherwise than as prisoners of war.
