NARROW-GUAGE RAILROAD MEETING: A meeting of the Directors of the Lancaster and Reading Narrow-Guage Railroad Company, was held in the office of Major R. W. Shenk, President, Monday morning at 14 o'clock. The Directors were all present with the exception of two. A resolution was adopted, directing notice to be given to the Pounsylvania Railroad Company that this company intends to cross that road at its intersection with Water street at

grade, and appointing a committee of three Directors and five additional stockholders, consisting of A. H. Peacock, chairman, Geo. K. Reed, C. A. Bitner, H. G. Smith, Dr. Henry Carpenter, S. S. Spencer, F. Shroder and Geo. M. Steinman, to take in charge the Water Street division of this goad, and the crossing of the Pennsylvania Microad. A committee of three, consisting of John D. Skiles, Wm. L. Peiper and Major R. W. Shenk, was appointed to take in charge all additional subscriptions. The report of E. D. North, esq., assistant solicitor, showed the securing of nearly three-fourths of the right of way upon very favorable terms. The report of the engineer, Mr. Geo. H. Arms, exhibited that the work had been actively commenced, and that at least \$10,000 worth of work would be done in December. He was directed by the Board to locate the road at Quarryville without delay. A resolution was also adopted calling in

ten per cent, per month of the capital stock until all is paid in. Hon. E. Billingfelt, who represented the northern section, reported that active efforts are now being made to put the main line under contract on the line already determined upon.

The Stocks, bonds and certificates of the company, as authorized by law, were ordered to be printed immediately, and the Board ananimously resolved to prosecute the work to completion without delay. The annual election for Directors will be held on the first Monday in January.

A FATAL COAL OIL EXPLOSION ; A COTTESpondent from Petersburg, furnishes us with the following account of a terrible coal oil lamp explosion which occurred at that villiage on Monday evening last:

Our community was startled on Monday evening with the announcement that an explosion took place from a coal oil lamp at the residence of Jacob H. Graybill, residing half a mile west of the village of Petersburg, this county. It appears after the family were through with their daily labors, and were congregated in their sitting-room, (except Jacob Graybill, who had gone from home on account of besidess). Mrs. Graybill had her vontigest child on her lap, and during this time, the child overturned the lamp. which was standing in close proximity to where they were sitting, and in an instant the whole room was in ene sheet of flame. But for the presence of udial of Mr. Adam Graybill and an aged lady by the name of Miss Polly Dommy, no de dot the whole building would have been burned. Mrs. Graybill and five of her childrea were badly burned. The smallest child, (whose name 1 believe is Harry,) was to badly burned in the face, arms and hands, that death came to his relief on Tue-day night, at 11 o'clock. The next youngest, a girl, is also seriously burned, and may prove fatal. Amanda Graybill, a young lady, is also seriously barned on her arms and hands. Fanny and Adam are

slightly barned. SHOOFING STARS: On Wednesday evening from about six until after seven o'clock there was a very great display of meteors. At first most of them seemed to pass in a direction from north to south, with occasionally one passing from the zenith directly cast or west : later they seemed to pass from a point a little east of the zenith in a north-castwardly and south-eastwardly direction. They were very different in appearance ; some a mere flash of light passing across the sky, others a well defined nucleus passing with great rapidity, others with a train of fire moving behind them like a rocket. Occasionally one would move in a curved line as though through a medium too dense to allow straight motion to co-light a body. During the early part of the di-play they were almost constant; sometimes two or more being visible at same time : later they were less frequent. 


