#### Monster Banquet.

Preparing to Entertain 1770 Railroad Men. The Cincinnati mind will be occupied this week with the great Southern railroad excursion and banquet. It is the means adopted by the merchants and manufac-turers of Cincinnati of forming the acquaintance of the bussness men of the region opened to trade by the new Southern railroad. Delegations will come from Tennessee, Alabama, Georgia and South Carolina. They will be brought from Chattanooga in three long trains and returned there, transportation free. Arriving there this evening, they will be driven to Music hall, where the banquet will be spread. The arrangements for this feast are on a colossal scale. Thirty tables on the floor of the auditorium will seat 1,470 guests; ten on the stage, 240, and these, with the reporters' and special tables, will make the total number of plates set 1,770. The contract for the banquet was taken by Mr. Roth, of the St. Nicholas, at \$15,000. There will be 500 waiters, all colored men, dressed in uniform, with white gloves and jackets. The tables will be set with 9,000 glasses, 3,600 dessert plates, 5,400 dinner plates and other articles in proportion. The floral decorations will be elaborate, one of the features being a locomotive eight feet in length. The streets traversed by the party from the depot to the Music hall will be brilliantly illuminated, and an effort is being made to secure a general illumination of the city. The object of the Cincinnati merchants is to impress the visitors with the city's hospitality and good will toward them and so lay the foundation for future profitable business relations. The excursion partics will have nearly all their expenses paid from the time they start till they return to their homes. Some difficulty has been experienced in making a proper distribution of invitations, and complaints are made from the lower end of the line that lawyers and politicians have secured an undue share. Through trains are running daily on the new road and making good schedule time.
